Janet Johnson Elected to the Executive Committee of the National Conference of Appellate Court Clerks

Janet Johnson, Clerk of Court of the Arizona Supreme Court, was elected to the Executive Committee of the National Conference of Appellate Court Clerks at the organization's recent annual meeting in Denver, Colorado.

Janet Johnson was appointed Clerk of Court of the Arizona Supreme Court in 2012. Previously, she served as the Director of the Court Services Division of the Arizona Administrative Office of the Courts for twelve years and, prior to arriving in Arizona, as the Assistant Director of the Court Services Division at the Missouri Administrative Office of the Courts. Ms. Johnson holds a master's degree in Social Work from the University of Missouri-Columbia, with an emphasis in planning and administration, and is a Fellow of the Institute for Court Management. She has been a member of the NCACC since 2012 and has served on the Public Relations, Site Selection, and Strategic Planning Committees of the NCACC.

The National Conference of Appellate Court Clerks was established in 1973 with the objectives of improving the skills and knowledge of its members, promoting effective court administration, providing a forum for the exchange of ideas, and maintaining facilities for the dissemination of information concerning appellate court operations.
