Malcolm H. Squires, Jr. Confirmed to Executive Committee of the National Conference of Appellate Court Clerks

Malcolm [Mac] H. Squires, Jr. Judicial Advisor and Clerk of Court for the U.S. Army Court of Criminal Appeals, has been confirmed to the Executive Committee of the National Conference of Appellate Court Clerks (NCACC).

Mr. Squires was appointed as the Judicial Advisor and Clerk of Court for the US Army Court of Criminal Appeals in September 2002. Following graduation from law school, Mr. Squires spent 26 years on active duty with the U.S. Army Judge Advocate General's Corps where he held a number of important leadership positions before retiring as an appellate judge on the court he now serves. Mac received both in undergraduate and law school degrees from Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Virginia.

The National Conference of Appellate Court Clerks was established in 1973 with the objectives of improving the skills and knowledge of its members, promoting effective court administration, providing a forum for the exchange of ideas, and maintaining facilities for the dissemination of information concerning appellate court operations.
